From the chair...

Hopefully we are on the last leg!

et again our plans are being frustrated by the recent update from Downing Street, and our plans to stage Frank's Final Redemption? in July have suffered a set back.

You will see that we have new dates to stage this show that will re-open the Ice Factory Studio Theatre, although the way the last 16 months have gone, who knows?!?

We have held several meetings including committee members and trustees to look at where we stand, and our biggest challenge is to make our audiences feel confident enough to come back in to the Ice Factory Studio Theatre.

Things we are looking at include ventilation in the studio space to ensure a good supply of fresh air from outside, but without affecting the temperature in the space.

A 'One Way' system is also being looked at, along with at seat service for interval drinks. Nothing is off the table, and we are looking at all areas of our operations to see what we need to do to make audiences feel safe and confident.

Realistically, we are probably looking at September before we may be able to return to the stage with confidence, but we are constantly reviewing the situation.

This postponement does, I am sorry to say, take an extra Autumn production off the table.

I would like to thank Steve Wreford and Gordon Mellor along with Ken Swan and Margaret Long who had already put a great deal of time and effort in to this production. Your efforts will not be wasted!


Panto and in to 2022

The show WILL go on

Steve Wreford and Gordon Mellor have written the play during lockdown and immediately saw it as being the ideal small cast vehicle to reopen the Ice Factory Studio Theatre.

Frank's life story unfolds, alongside many of his most popular songs including big hitters **New York**, **New York** and **My Way** are set alongside less known, but surprisingly alluring songs such as **I Fall In Love Too Easily** and **Nancy - with the laughing face**.

Sinatra's brush with the mafia, his relationships with US presidents and Rat Pack buddies will of course get an airing; But the audience also gets to learn about his generosity, love for his family and his stand for racial equality.

This musical play tells the story of one of America's greatest 20th Century entertainers through his own words and music.

Frank's Final Redemption?

The story is set in the familiar surroundings of a saloon bar in Hoboken during the early hours of the morning, Sinatra is sat slumped at the bar with St. Peter posing as a barman at The Pearly Gates Hotel.

Sinatra enjoys his favoured bourbon - Jack Daniels, while St. Peter questions him about his relationships, friends and lovers revealing the highs and lows of his life at his final redemption.

We haven't opened the box office just yet, but we will let you know as soon as we do.

Children will audition in small groups of three with one parent present as needed.

You will not be able to turn up to audition without an allocated time-slot.

Face-covering and social distancing regulations will apply.

Subject to individuals' availability, it may be that there will be some re-auditioning opportunities, but these will be advertised on a play-by-play basis as needed.








2021 Annual General Meeting

Things need to be a bit different this year

Ithough it is hoped that COVID restrictions will be lifted by 19th July, our arrangements for the AGM of Teignmouth Players are being made to keep everyone safe, so we do need to ask most of you to join us from home via 'Zoom'.



We do have to ask members who have not had an attend 'in-person' request confirmed, to not turn up at the Ice Factory on the day.

You will not need to download any 'App' for your computer, phone or tablet to log-in on 'zoom'. All the usual reports and relevant paperwork that

you would normally be handed when you attend the meeting will be sent to you about a week advance of the meeting, and any questions or 'AOB' items should be submitted in advance (anyone who has had the pleasure of taking part in on-line meetings over the last 16 months will understand why!!)

Management structure of Teignmouth Players

Some members may not be fully aware of the management structure of the Society, which changed when the CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) was formed in 2018.

The Trustees are responsible for the strategic management of the Society, and are registered with the Charities Commission. In line with Charities Commission guidelines, Trustees are appointed rather than voted for at an AGM and will normally serve a term of three years before their position is reviewed. The Trustees delegate powers to the committee for the day-to day running of the Society whose members are normally elected for a two year term.

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If you wish to know more about the responsibilties of being a charity trustee, information can be found at **gov.uk**.

Sadly, it is not all 'tea and biscuits', and being a committee member carries significant responsibilities and they are critical to the smooth running of the Society. You need to be be prepared to commit to attending meetings normally at least once a month, and be prepared to take responsibility for overseeing the management of certain areas of our operations. As with all our core activities, committee members and trustees are not paid.

must not drill holes in to walls or ceilings to fix sets. Everything can be clamped to the truss using approved clamps.

We are looking forward to welcoming you to the newly spruced up studio space very soon!

Front of house training

Elf'n'safety is something none of us can ignore

This is the usual area that everyone moans about, but remember Health and Safety is nothing new, and the laws covering it have now been in place for almost 50 years.

We do have some training needs that need addressing as we approach re-opening the Ice Factory Studio Theatre, and one of the most important areas are those who volunteer on the hospitality side of things.

Those who have shown an interest in helping Front of House will be contacted in the coming weeks.

Training will include what needs to happen in the event of an emergency and possible evacuation of the building, and ensuring the safety of the audience are the centre of your focus at all times.

FIRST AID SERVICE OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPE

Members who received training during our last set of First Aid training sessions will need refresher training which is required every three years.

We need to have trained and qualified first aiders on the premises for ALL EVENTS, and those previously trained by us need their registration renewed.

You will not be expected to carry out complex procedures, and neither will you be administering any medication other than possibly aspirin under very limited circumstances or possibly an epi-pen, but full training will be given.

The job of a first-aider is, more often than not, to make the casualty comfortable, and to put a basic dressing on a wound until emergency services arrive to take over.

If this is something you feel you can help us with, please let us know, but without several members volunteering for roles such as this, we cannot reopen. We did put out a call for this on the Members' Facebook page and had a couple of responses, but we do need more qualified volunteers please.

Remember EVERYONE is responsible for the health and safety of themselves and others

Expenses claims

Money makes the world go around

As our activities start up again in the coming months, it is worth reminding everyone of the updated internal procedures to make sure we can trace, analyse and audit our finances better as well as help us get your money to you more quickly. If you have expenses to claim or wish to purchase goods

or services on behalf of the society please check with the appropriate budget holder before making purchases on behalf of the Society.

If you need to travel on Society business, any claim for this must be agreed in advance of the trip.



Essentially, expenditure falls into four areas

- Production expenditure:
 For this you will be able to spend as long as the production budget has been signed of by the committee.
- 2. Project based expenditure: This will need a project budget, which will also need to be signed off by the committee and/or Trustees.
- 3. Expenses: You should check with a member of the committee or the treasurer prior to spending. These should be claimed back retrospectively using an expenses claim form.
- 4. Petty cash: These are for minor purchases such as the coffee, tea, milk etc. for the kitchen, cleaning products etc. As long as you have a receipt, you can ask a member of the committee to refund these to you directly from the petty cash box.

For ALL claims, please note a proper receipt MUST be provided.

The membership year has been altered so it now the same as our financial year, meaning subs will now be due on 1st May each year.


With subscriptions currently set at just £10 a year for full membership, they are far lower than the average for similar societies in the area, where some are charging over £100 (+ joining fee).


