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



A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

Roberto Zucco is a killer on the loose. Or is he, in fact, a secret agent?

Teignmouth Players are delighted to present this truly unique play to The Ice Factory. Director Stephen Andrews (Blackadder II; The Dumb Waiter) is thrilled to have assembled such an amazing cast to bring this beautiful, ludicrous, and often unnerving show, 25 years in the making, to you.

Join Zucco as he escapes over the prison rooftops and track him as he embarks across an abstract landscape in a series of absurdly comic scenes, that dare the audience to laugh. Occasionally shocking, often surreal; this performance is unlikely to be like anything you've seen, but we believe can be as much of a 'hit' amongst theatre lovers, as those who don't ordinarily enjoy theatre. Such as the writer...

Bernard-Marie Kolts is France's most popular playwright around the world, translated into 40 different languages, yet is rarely performed in the UK. He was considered one of the most important young voices in theatre at the time of his death, in 1989, and heir apparent to the legacy left by post-war playwrights such as Pinter and Beckett.

This production is not suitable for children, but, we believe, everyone else needs to experience it at least once! Like witnessing an eclipse, dreaming you can fly, or eating a Pot Noodle... In a Travel Lodge. Originally slated for 2020, just before our own world shut down, and itself turned a shade darker and more surreal; we are looking forward to finally sharing this unusual, yet remarkable work with you.

This translation, first performed in the UK by the Royal Shakespeare Company in 1998, is a one-of-a-kind production that genuinely defies styles and genres. At least, as we know them. Only a very special cast could do justice to this extraordinary text, and that is precisely what we have. This incredibly talented group have worked so hard. And, we're led to believe, had a lot of fun on the way. Please come and support them. We promise you, whatever you think of Roberto Zucco, you'll certainly never forget it!







A WORD FROM A COUPLE OF THE CAST

Roberto Zucco is a play that looks insightfully into what it takes to be 'normal.' It questions perceived 'good' and 'moral' behaviours demonstrated by humanity on a daily basis and asks the audience to consider whether we just adhere to social norms, yet in fact, harbour much deeper, darker and even murderous desires that lie suppressed behind the veil of conditioned social decency.

Koltes purposefully does not name his characters giving them generic titles instead. This is intentional, as each symbolise a facet of society that is broken, or are an allegorical victim of destructive Capitalist society. I play the role of sister- a complicated character who resides in a dysfunctional family and is the buffer of tension for all the familial problems. The family is only held together by love, yet each member or the family is unable to express this feeling in any form of meaningful way. Instead, the dynamics

t has been a delight to take part in this play. We have been able to get away from our hectic, sometimes unfriendly and stressful lives into a vicious world of squalor, murder and mayhem. Almost every character is really awful - Steve has cast it so well, by the way!

Only one of them is worthy of redemption – I won't name him – modestly forbids.

At least he will be safe... Or will he?

To be serious for a moment, it is difficult to get through 15 minutes of rehearsal without us all breaking into laughter of this family are oppressive and sinister. Slowly, the audience watch the family unravel in the most destructive way leaving my character bereft and painfully lonely. This culminates in a poignant monologue in which the sister is left unable to consolidate her own identity without the presence of her sister; the misogynistic world becomes even more petrifying for her.

In bringing this play to the stage, Steve Andrew's has allowed time for us all to discuss character intentions and motivations. There has been a great dynamic between the director and cast which has led to the creation of a provocative piece of collaborative theatre. It is certainly different to Teignmouth Player's usual repertoire, however, in my humble option this is an evocative piece of theatre that is not to be missed. Director, Al Dunn writes:

Preparations for **Two** are now in full swing and the excitement is building every week. Rehearsals started earlier this month, and we're all getting stuck in to building the characters and the environment to put on a great experience that will make the characters feel like your friends.

We're planning so much more than just a play with Two - you'll barely recognise the theatre - to give you a chance to have a night out with friends and see a theatre performance that will bring you joy and make you think. **Two** offers you a view of everyday pub life in all it's gritty, uncomfortable honesty while throwing laughs into the bargain at the same time.

We're really looking forward to welcoming you to your new local and hope to see you there in May for a pint or **Two!**



Teignmouth Player's Pantomime Sleeping Beauty embodies the very essence and magic of pantomime. From the moment you take your seat, your journey into the enchanted lands and realms of the fairytale world begin. Greeted by a vibrant lighting scape and an upbeat opening number, the talented cast promise you a memorable and joyous few hours from the outset of this production.

Ensuring the enchantment of fairytale is established firmly from the beginning of the show, Fairy Lavender, played by **Elizabeth Borbon**, sparkles charm and 'goodness' that passes seamlessly from stage to audience. Starkly contrasting Lavender's sweetness, **Ben Tisdall's** Carabosse, oozes wickedness and malevolence. The conflict between good and evil is clearly drawn out from the beginning of this tale and the audience desire that the hero of this story will soon triumph over adversity in the face of virtual despair.

And of course with Sleeping Beauty the inevitable despair centres on our ill fated heroine. **Mary Borbon's** Princess Aurora epitomises grace and gentleness. Her Prince, played by the talented **Emma Firth**, is the perfect principal boy; her solo in Act two is delivered with style and innate musicality. Fortunately, as the fairytale dictates, love reverses Aurora's fate and these two have their happy ending. Charmingly, **Amy Burton- Smith's** narrative includes a flashback to our two heroes chance childhood encounter. This moment is beautifully portrayed by **Ezme Firth** and **Becca Smith/Maddison Shill** who provoke smiles from the audience as they sweetly sing a love ballad together.

No pantomime is complete without an element of absurdity and a good dose of slapstick comedy. In this rendition of Sleeping Beauty, Burton-Smith includes two partnerships that are guaranteed to provoke laughter and mirth. Laura Wilson-Back's Queen Bustlebum is skilfully played and she demonstrates that she is fully versed with both the blatant and nuanced elements of pantomime comedy. Her partner- King Bustlebum compliments her well, as he bustles and bumbles around the stage with comic aplomb. Reddy and Willing, played by Piran Wills and Gavin Smith respectively, are wonderfully in tune with each other and joyfully revel in being farcical and ludicrous when the script dictates. As the master of farce and preposterousness, Andy Killen, shines in the role of Dame Trotty- this is an actor who is clearly au fait with Pantomime

gags and his comic timing is impeccable. His sidekick- Boring Alice- is played by **Karen Allen** who, as usual, dazzles on stage. Allen shows her acting experience in this production and you are immediately endeared to her character from her first appearance. Her moments with Slumber, portrayed by **Louie Robb** are both poignant and comic; a hard feat to accomplish and one both actors should be congratulated for. An unexpected moment of comedy comes from the characters of the Gypsies who all work as an effective collective to bring further comedy to the stage. A special mention must go to **Angela Mayo- Caroll** (Freda) whose spectacular singing voice not only adds to the chorus of Gypsies but the overall ensemble numbers. Burton-Smith's script ensures everyone sparkles and the carefully timed puns and gags delivered by the talking trees, enthusiastic chefs and jesters are delivered cleverly.

Carmen Louise's choreography is dynamic and full of energy. The UV scene in the midst of Act One is a visual spectacle and one of the best representations of this Pantomime tradition I have ever seen on an amateur stage. If there is to be any criticism of this pantomime it is that the music backing tracks could have perhaps been edited to a more professional standardone that matched the talent on the stage. However, due to the cast enthusiasm and diligent work of the choreographer, this small flaw is completely overcome.

Overall this pantomime is worth every penny. It is full of vibrant costuming, technical brilliance, cast enthusiasm and absurd hilarity. It demonstrates that the tradition of Pantomime is alive and thriving in the South West.

Volunteering



There are many ways to help support our little theatre group. All are vitally important. Here are a few that we'd love you to think about.

Chaperone training

As most of you will be aware, to put on any show that involves children, there have to be chaperones in place to take care of the little darlings. We literally cannot put a show on without them. To become a chaperone, is quite an easy process. You need to have the usual ID to prove that you are who you say you are, and then take a reasonably simple test with a lovely lady at Babcocks, usually by video link. We pay the costs for that, and your licence is valid for three years. We would then ask that you commit to a couple of performances during the run of the show; usually our pantomimes.

Front of house and bar stewards

This is another area where a show can't take place without a Front of House (FoH) team and someone to run the bar. In a nutshell, we require three people to for the FoH team; one to be stationed in the foyer and check the tickets of the audience as they arrive, one to sell raffle tickets and programmes and one to act as House Steward meeting and greeting people as they enter the auditorium to take their seats. One of the FoH team would we designated as Safety Officer and would sit in the jump seat near the tech desk, and just keep an eye to make sure all is well. As the title suggests, as Bar Steward, you would be running our well stocked, well organised bar. Little training is needed, but for your first time, you would be put with someone who is experienced, just to show you the setting up and closing down procedures.

Morning box office

We open the Box Office in the mornings one week before a show starts, and then during the run of the show. We open from 10am to 12md, using TicketSource ticket provider. The system is very easy to use, and I will do the training. You wouldn't be expected to take a morning shift until you were completely comfortable to be left, and I'm very often only a phone call away.

First aid and fire marshal training

We need to increase the number of people who have First Aid and Fire Marshal training. The First Aid takes approximately six hours, plus a break and the Fire Marshal training is approximately four hours and includes operating fire extinguishers.

Thursday morning working party

There are always little odd jobs (and sometimes not so little) that need doing to keep the Ice Factory running, particularly in the days prior to any of our shows opening. If you're at a loose end on Thursday mornings, then please come and join us. You will be amply rewarded with a nice cuppa, biscuits, and sometimes cake. I'm usually in the Box Office every Thursday from around 10.30, so you can also pop in for a chat and a cuppa.

A reminder about Expenses claims

Money makes the world go around

As our activities start up again in the coming months, it is worth reminding everyone of the updated internal procedures to make sure we can trace, analyse and audit our finances better as well as help us get your money to you more quickly. If you have expenses to claim or wish to purchase goods

or services on behalf of the society please check with the appropriate budget holder before making purchases on behalf of the Society.

If you need to travel on Society business, any claim for this must be agreed in advance of the trip.

Essentially, expenditure falls into four areas.

1. Production expenditure:

For this you will be able to spend as long as the production budget has been signed of by the committee.

2. Project based expenditure:

This will need a project budget, which will also need to be signed off by the committee and/or Trustees.

- Expenses: You should check with a member of the committee or the treasurer prior to spending. These should be claimed back retrospectively using an expenses claim form.
- 4. Petty cash: These are for minor purchases such as the coffee, tea, milk etc. for the kitchen, cleaning products etc. As long as you have a receipt, you can ask a member of the committee to refund these to you directly from the petty cash box.

For ALL claims, please note a proper receipt MUST be provided.
