





From the chair...

WE'RE BACK!! THE ICE FACTORY STUDIO THEATRE WILL RE-OPEN ON STH SEPTEMBER!

Many will know, the Ice Factory Studio Theatre is due to re-open next week with our new and original musical play Frank's Final Redemption?

We are making the final preparations now for the production that feels like we have been looking forward to forever.

Theatre is making a return, and although cautious, we are looking forward to welcoming you back and for your support for this new and original production.

As we know, the next months, possibly longer are going to present challenges for the Society that we have not faced in the past. Cautious audiences being one of them, and we need to work together to make everyone feel that they are safe returning to theatre, that we all love.

I have written more about this later, but as much as we want to have a carefree theatre experience, there is still a need for some precautions to be in place for the foreseeable future for everyone's protection and in order to give reassurance to those who are understandably very nervous about life returning to normal.

I and the trustees know different people have different views on how quickly the return to 'normal' should progress, but we ask that all members and visitors to the Ice Factory Studio Theatre work together, showing consideration to everyone, allowing space, and show understanding and empathy for the genuine concerns people have. This is going to be a longer process for some than it will be for others and we all need to make EVERYONE welcome and at ease, especially those who are unsure.

To help those feeling less confident, there will be a Socially distanced performance on Thursday 9th September, but book now as seats will obviously be limited.

Having just worked away for a week running tech on a show in Peterborough last week at a large 1,000+ seat venue, I know from experience how difficult the return is for many.

Please remember Teignmouth Players is YOUR society, and relies on your support and input, so please book your tickets so we can make the re-opening a success! I am delighted to be able to tell you we have a new wardrobe manager, **Naomi Keslake**, known as 'Kez'.

Naomi has had years of experience dressing shows for our friends at Exeter Little Theatre Company, and I am confident she will be a great asset to Teignmouth Players, and has already set to work with Jane Athey finding out what we have in our wardrobe stock.

Welcome Kez, we look forward to working with you!

Frank's Final Redemption?

TREALINS HAPPENING 8-12 & 16-18 SEPTEMBER

Steve Wreford and **Gordon Mellor** have written the play during lock-down and immediately saw it as being the ideal small cast vehicle to reopen the Ice Factory Studio Theatre.

Frank's life story unfolds, alongside many of his most popular songs including big hitters **New York**, **New York** and **My Way** are set alongside less known, but surprisingly alluring songs such as **I Fall In Love Too Easily** and **Nancy - with the laughing face**.

Sinatra's brush with the Mafia, his relationships with US presidents and Rat Pack buddies will of course get an airing; But the audience also gets to learn about his generosity, love for his family and his stand for racial equality. This musical play tells the story of one of America's greatest 20th Century entertainers through his own words and music.

The story is set in the familiar surroundings of a saloon bar in Hoboken during the early hours of the morning, Sinatra is sat slumped at the bar with St. Peter posing as a barman at The Pearly Gates Hotel.

TO BOOK

Sinatra enjoys his favoured bourbon - Jack Daniels, while St. Peter questions him about his relationships, friends and lovers revealing the highs and lows of his life at his final redemption. A REMINDER THAT THURSDAY 9TH SEPTEMBER WILL BE A SOCIALLY DISTANCED PERFORMANCE.

ith over 40 years experience working at local theatres throughout the West Country, Steve comes to this production with a wealth of knowledge, having previously played leading roles in West Side Story and Mack 'n' Mabel at the Theatre Royal, Plymouth; Jesus Christ Superstar, The Broadway version of Pirates of Penzance and the musical **Annie** at the Northcott Theatre, Exeter; As well as touring in a number of musicals taking in the Octagon Theatre, Yeovil, Queens Theatre, Barnstaple and Hall for Cornwall Truro and the Princess Theatre, Torquay.

ordon comes from a musical family. In the 1920s, Gordon's father, Cyril Mellor (and his Band) was popular in the Manchester area. Moving to Exeter University in 1972 to study modern languages, Gordon found that music took over. So he swapped to a degree in music and began a career teaching the subject to 'O' and 'A' level in 1978.



FINANCES

The treasurer's report was distributed to all members in advance of the meeting. Thanks to the Hayden Legacy, our finances are in good shape, although most of our funds are ear marked for Capital expenditure that will proceed, hopefully, soon. However, we have a tricky year ahead and need to be careful. The funds are not working for us sat in the Bank, and we are looking at how to use them to improve the experience for members and visitors alike.

The refurbishment plan is known to you all, and we hope we can proceed with this. If anyone would like to know more, let us know and we can give you details of what is planned.

We received two grants from the local authority during the COVID period that have been very welcome.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership subscriptions were agreed by those present to stay at £10 per year for full membership. It was noted that the new MemberMojo system allows for individuals to make additional donations over and above their normal subscription, and we are very grateful to those who have chosen to make an additional payment to us at this time. There is no compulsion to do so, but, obviously any such payments are accepted with great thanks.

Members being more fluid between Societies was raised, and this is covered elsewhere in this edition of Prompt.

JUNIORS

A question was asked about the future of our Junior section, and we had to report that at the moment our focus has to be getting the Society as a whole back on track after the disruption caused by the pandemic. Our Junior members are very much on our minds, and play a crucial part within Teignmouth Players, and we encourage our younger members to come forward to be involved in all areas of our activities.

We do need to be mindful of our safeguarding obligations, and where these allow, we look forward to involving our younger members as an integral part of the Society.

ONE ACT FESTIVALS

The subject of One Act Festivals was also raised, and we had to report that at this time, there are no plans for Teignmouth Players to put an entry forward for the 2022 festival. Our ongoing programme puts great demands on our members, and at this time, where post pandemic our membership numbers are lower than they have been, it is felt that the One Act Festival would stretch us that bit too far. Of course, it does not mean that this is a permanent change, and in future years circumstances may allow us to enter and hopefully enjoy the success we have had in past years.

Butterflies are free

As mentioned in the AGM report, the subject of the fluidity of members came up. This is, for some, a relatively new concept.

Frances Swan has written to say:

Dear Daniel,

At the recent Teignmouth Players AGM, reference was made to people going from theatre to theatre for acting rôles as 'butterflies' which I find insulting. I had never heard of that term before coming here as, in our last theatre, it is what many of us did. We had a wonderful time going to other theatres locally, gaining greater experiences of working in a different venue, working with a range of directors and actors and making new friends. In this way, we not only supported each other's productions, we helped by working behind the scenes, as you would for your friends.

If you wanted to go in to the professional theatre, this is what you would have to do anyway just to get the part you sought.

Also, looking at it from the audience's point of view, seeing new faces on the stage is refreshing, especially as most of our theatres are small and don't have many acting members.

feel this is something I need to respond to publicly, as it is an important subject. We need to embrace the fluidity of members and make it work in our favour.

To me, at least, the term 'butterflies' is not used as a derogatory term, but simply describes the fact that people will pick and choose what and where they perform.

Greater mobility and communications make this shift from the more historic feeling of single society membership inevitable and is, as Frances says in her letter, something that can be a positive experience for all.

At Teignmouth Players, I firmly believe we all have much to continue learning about the art of performance and the industry of Theatre. I have spent a lifetime working with many different groups and have learned from every experience, and am now able to work professionally in theatre where I am learning even more, and it doesn't matter if you are in a small Studio space such as the Ice Factory Studio Theatre (IFST), or a 1,000+ seat theatre, the principals are exactly the same and I know from experience there are many practices from each that are hugely relevant to the other.

This fluidity is a bit of a newer experience for us in Devon to the extent we are seeing it now, compared to other parts of the country, but if we fight against it, we will fade and die.

Teignmouth Players has 'its way' of doing things which on the whole work for us, but that should not mean that we ignore what others are doing, and the way to experience that is to work with our friends in other Societies and theatres, and by doing that, we can bring back good practices to the IFST and the Pavilions which will may improve our shows and production techniques, and audience experiences, and also make our membership of the Society a better experience for all.

So please, work with other groups and in different venues, learn from it and bring back your experiences. Invite people from other groups to work with us at the IFST and the Pavilions. There is always something new to learn and experience.

I know I am very privileged to have this platform to write to and respond to correspondence and share, where appropriate, with the wider membership. As many of you will know, clear and open communication is something I am a great believer in.

Front of house training

Elf'n'safety is something none of us can ignore

This is the usual area that everyone moans about, but remember Health and Safety is nothing new, and the laws covering it have now been in place for almost 50 years.

We do have some training needs that need addressing as we approach re-opening the Ice Factory Studio Theatre, and one of the most important areas are those who volunteer on the hospitality side of things.

Those who have shown an interest in helping Front of House will be contacted in the coming weeks.

Training will include what needs to happen in the event of an emergency and possible evacuation of the building, and ensuring the safety of the audience are the centre of your focus at all times.



Members who received training during our last set of First Aid training sessions will need refresher training which is required every three years.

We need to have trained and qualified first aiders on the premises for ALL EVENTS, and those previously trained by us need their registration renewed.

You will not be expected to carry out complex procedures, and neither will you be administering any medication other than possibly aspirin under very limited circumstances or possibly an epi-pen, but full training will be given.

The job of a first-aider is, more often than not, to make the casualty comfortable, and to put a basic dressing on a wound until emergency services arrive to take over.

If this is something you feel you can help us with, please let us know, but without several members volunteering for roles such as this, we cannot reopen. We did put out a call for this on the Members' Facebook page and had a couple of responses, but we do need more qualified volunteers please. Remember EVERYONE is responsible for the health and safety of themselves and others



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Keeping it clean

We are still looking for help to keep the Ice Factory Studio Theatre clean

A reminder about Expenses claims

Money makes the world go around

As our activities start up again in the coming months, it is worth reminding everyone of the updated internal procedures to make sure we can trace, analyse and audit our finances better as well as help us get your money to you more quickly. If you have expenses to claim or wish to purchase goods

or services on behalf of the society please check with the appropriate budget holder before making purchases on behalf of the Society.

If you need to travel on Society business, any claim for this must be agreed in advance of the trip.

Essentially, expenditure falls into four areas.

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1. Production expenditure:

For this you will be able to spend as long as the production budget has been signed of by the committee.

2. Project based expenditure:

This will need a project budget, which will also need to be signed off by the committee and/or Trustees.

- 3. Expenses: You should check with a member of the committee or the treasurer prior to spending. These should be claimed back retrospectively using an expenses claim form.
- 4. Petty cash: These are for minor purchases such as the coffee, tea, milk etc. for the kitchen, cleaning products etc. As long as you have a receipt, you can ask a member of the committee to refund these to you directly from the petty cash box.

For ALL claims, please note a proper receipt MUST be provided.

To continue enjoying the benefits of membership, please renew now if you haven't done already. Reminder letters will be going out shortly inviting those who have not yet renewed to do so.

Hopefully you have managed to log-in to the system now using the email address you have given us, and renewed your membership for 2021/22 year.

The membership year has been altered so it now the same as our financial year, meaning subs will now be due on 1st May each year.
